

Decision No. 019/ SP 1121

IN THE MATTER of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

AND

IN THE MATTER of an application by **TE KUITI TRAPSHOOTERS CLUB INCORPORATED** pursuant to s.137 of the Act for a special licence, in respect of an events to be held at premises situated at **LEES BLOCK ROAD, RD5, TE KUITI** known as the **TE KUITI TRAPSHOOTERS CLUB ROOMS**

THE APPLICATION

The Waitomo District Licensing Committee has before it an application by **TE KUITI TRAPSHOOTERS CLUB INCORPORATED** for an **on-site** special licence pursuant to section 137 of the Act.

The events leading to this application are to be held at LEES BLOCK ROAD, RD5, TE KUITI known as **TE KUITI TRAPSHOOTERS CLUB ROOMS** and can be summarised as follows:

Clay target shooting sporting competitions:

- Saturday 10 and Sunday 11 January 2015
- Sunday 8 February 2015
- Saturday 28 February and Sunday 1 March 2015
- Sunday 12 April 2015
- Saturday 25 April 2015
- Sunday 10 May 2015
- Sunday 14 June 2015
- Sunday 12 July 2015
- Sunday 9 August 2015
- Sunday 13 September 2015
- Sunday 11 October 2015

These events are not considered to be large scale events in accordance with section 143 of the Act.

DECISION OF THE COMMITTEE

No objections have been filed in respect to this application pursuant to section 140 of the Act, and it is therefore determined on the papers by the Chairperson alone in accordance with section 191(2) of the Act.

Reports have been received from the Police, the Medical Officer of Health and the Licensing Inspector. No concerns have been raised in respect to the criteria outlined in section 42 of the Act.

There is no information to question the applicant's suitability and it is felt they have appropriate systems, staff and training in place to comply with the law. This, combined with the design of the intended premises, and the availability of food, low and non-alcoholic beverages leads to the conclusions that there is unlikely to be any negative effect on the amenity and good order of the area, and that ultimately the application satisfies the object of the Act.

However, in order to ensure that is the case, a number of conditions have been recommended in respect to the application. Namely:

1. Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the following hours:
 - Saturday 10 and Sunday 11 January 2015
 - Sunday 8 February 2015
 - Saturday 28 February and Sunday 1 March 2015
 - Sunday 12 April 2015
 - Saturday 25 April 2015
 - Sunday 10 May 2015
 - Sunday 14 June 2015
 - Sunday 12 July 2015
 - Sunday 9 August 2015
 - Sunday 13 September 2015
 - Sunday 11 October 2015

From 9.00am until 5.00pm
2. The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - (i) Display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons;
 - (ii) Request evidence of age documents from any person appearing to be under the age of 25.
3. The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises are observed:
 - (i) The persons nominated to manage the conduct of the sale and supply of alcohol at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol is Neil Murray Pratt and Murray Carlyle Pratt.
 - (ii) All bar staff will be trained in their responsibilities under the Act;
4. Drinking water must be freely available at the following places while the premises are open for business: at the
bar.
5. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when alcohol may be sold under the licence, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
6. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at the time alcohol is available for sale in the nature of pies, sandwiches, cakes, hot chips or barbecued food or a cooked meal.
7. The licensee must take the following steps to provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises: actively encourage the use of sober drivers.

Having due regard to the application and the reports received, the application is hereby approved, subject to the above conditions. This special licence may be issued immediately and shall remain in force until the conclusion of the final event as detailed in condition 1 above.
