
point the plants I have left get put out at the stand anyway; because, and I know it's hard to believe, I can't spend all day on tomatoes.

## **Election Debate held in Piopio**

KING COUNTRY River Care (KCRC) held a candidate's debate early in September in Piopio, and hope residents left a little more informed ahead of this year's election.

Candidates were treated to a full house at the Fat Owl, with close to 120 people in attendance.

The community heard from current Taranaki- King Country MP and National candidate Barbara Kuriger, as well as Labour list MP Angela Roberts, former Federated Farmers president Andrew Hoggard who is standing for ACT in Rangitikei, and independent candidate Bill Burr.

Each candidate was asked to prepare a 10-minute address which focused on their parties' ideas and solutions for rural and farming communities.


Max Lamb, Te Kuiti based lawyer chaired the debate, which was followed by a 30-minute Q&A session from the floor.





### **Exhibition Celebrating - The Past Leads Us Forward**

At Piopio Primary School this year, the concept for learning has been 'The Past Leads us Forward'. During this learning the tamariki have learnt and shared more about their stories, and been to visit some significant places in our area. In Addition to this learning, tamariki have become more technologically capable. They have learnt to code and use programmes to share their learning.

To celebrate their learning achievements each class created an exhibit so they could share their ideas with their whānau and the wider community. Each class developed a different theme for their exhibit. This did not happen on purpose. Through discussion as new learning occurred, tamariki in each class were interested in a different aspect of our past.







The junior classes focused on Kupe and Te Wheke and the journey to Aotearoa. Dioramas were built, showcasing their special place. There were also waka built and beebots (robots) programmed to show the journey Kupe made from Hawaiki. The year 4 class were really interested in the contribution men in the community played during the World Wars. Their display had a military flavour, with videos and stories.







One of the senior classes focused on life in the 1940-50's. They created dioramas and websites to share learning about transport, entertainment and food. To access the websites you needed to scan the QR code. The other senior class created newspapers that reported on the potato blight, signing of the covenant and Paemako School's first bus along with other interesting local historical information. When visitors viewed the newspapers they thought they were from the 1800's as the tamariki had aged them to look historic.

### Āria School celebrates Te Wiki o te Reo Māori

From September 11-18, as a country, we celebrated Te Wiki o te Reo Māori.

At Āria School all our students start the day celebrating and learning te reo Māori in the library for a 30-minute Te Ao Māori session exploring and practising the reo and listening to traditional stories related to our area, among other things.

Our tuakana-teina (Tuakana-teina is a concept from te ao Māori and refers to the relationship between an older (tuakana) person and a younger (teina) person) groupings give all students a chance to be supported to practice their reo daily. This is an amazing way to start our day and always starts and ends with a karakia (blessing) for a happy and fulfilling school day ahead.





The Craigs Investment Partners Limited Financial Advice Provider Disclosure Statement can be viewed at craigsip.com/tcs THE Mōkau Museum – established by the Tainui Historical Society in 1985 – and its team of volunteers collect, preserve, document, research, and display natural history and cultural heritage artefacts from the wider Tainui region.

The Museum Committee commissioned Taranaki builder Aaron Collins Builders Ltd to construct an accessibility ramp and accompanying roof structure following an extensive design and planning process. However, unexpected additional build and architectural costs have exhausted the project contingency.

Mōkau Museum Chairperson Murray Seamark explains, "The old building facades were rotten, the power supply rusted out and the building boundary was different to what is documented in the plans, which resulted in more design and foundation works."

"We need to raise an additional \$50,000 by December to complete the project, and we need the help of our community.

"Contributions from major and ongoing sponsors are fixed, and while we're grateful for their support, we've exhausted these funds.

Seamark continues, "Our community museum punches above its weight. Many of the taonga in the museum have been donated or are on loan from local families and it's our duty as Kaitiaki to ensure we're able to continue to preserve, care for and share these precious taonga with our community."

The current refurbishment project will enable people of all abilities access – opening the museum to a wider audience – in addition to revamping some of the existing displays.




