In my last article I mentioned that the Collection Audit project was coming to an end and that we are looking forward to the next phase. It is with great sadness that both Amanda and Chrissy have decided to resign their positions in the Museum take the opportunity to open a new chapter in their lives. Both Amanda and Chris have worked on and off in the Museum for the past five years and when there wasn't the money to pay them, they continued to volunteer donating their time and resources. Many things visible to the public, and most things behind the scenes can be attributed to the tireless and dedicated work they have put into this community.

Over the past two years the Museum has been actively pursuing a policy of involvement with Maori as tangata whenua and in particular our local marae, Maniaroa. Chris has also been a faithful volunteer that often covered the gaps alongside her own rostered days as well as managing all activities around the Gallery. Chrissy, I suppose we won't know how much we will miss you until later on.

Much of the routine life of the Museum over the past 2-3 years has been carried out by Amanda and Chris and now we are going to find others with these skills to help us along. While Amanda has taught many volunteers how to accession items and register these on the database, we need people with specific skills in web design, graphic design, and social media. We are also need someone to take over the Gallery, not forgetting more help to welcome guests and visitors. If this sounds like something you can help with, please get in touch.

Amanda and Chris the Committee thanks you for your work in the Museum and wishes you each well for what the future holds. Tenā korua.

TAINUI HISTORICAL SOCIETY

MAGISTRATES COURT LICENSING LAWS CHARGES FOR SELLING DISMISSED

(Taranaki Daily News 17 December 1920)

At the Magistrates Court, New Plymouth, yesterday His Worship gave reserved judgement in prosecutions instituted by the police concerning traffic in liquor in the Awakino district.

The first case was that against James Ross, the charge being of keeping liquor for sale within a proclaimed area. In reviewing the evidence, His Worship remarked that the police case rested on the fact that Ross had had more liquor within the time mentioned than was reasonably necessary for his own consumption, and that prima facie there was a presumption that he had been keeping liquor for sale. One had to bear in mind the unusual conditions existing in Awakino. It had come out in evidence there was a system of almost wholesale borrowing of liquor from one another among the residents. The circumstances of the amount of liquor received by defendant were very suspicious, but apart from that there did not seem to be the slightest evidence of suspicious conduct on the part of the defendant. There was not sufficient evidence to justify a conviction.

In giving judgement His Worship remarked on the custom which existed in the district of persons borrowing whisky from friends, the liquor being returned when they got their next case in. In a no- licence area the principle was liable to be abused, and in the case under review the defendant lent eight bottles to three people within a few days. The question for consideration was whether the transaction amounted to a sale. In dismissing the case he said, I would like to give a word of warning to the residents of the district that my decision is based on the grounds that the alleged borrowing is bona fide.



Angela and I have agreed and will agree on a number of issues while retaining our philosophical political differences.

While I have been your MP for 6 years I have met many people and covered every square kilometre of the electorate many times. I am also mindful that there are many of you who I haven't yet had the opportunity of meeting. I invite you to make yourselves known when I'm out and about and I'm always open to invitations, I welcome them. I am committed to attending as many as possible where there is no diary clashes.

For the past four years, I have been the Senior Whip for the National Caucus, a role I move on from this week to take on portfolios, Energy and Resources, Rural Communities, Food Safety and Associate Transport. 


