The museum opened again under C.Delta level 2 along with the new controls and our volunteers were pleased to get involved again, however with our Auckland whānau still incarcerated visitor numbers reflected the reduced domestic travel. Here's hoping that restrictions will open up for our friends up north soon.

During the lockdown two refurbished computers turned up for the museum. Our appreciation to Digital Wings for this. These guys take donated used corporate computers, clean them up and refurbish them before giving them a second life out within the many charitable organisations in Aotearoa. Earlier this year the museum took stock and reviewed its long term strategic and annual plan that takes us into 2022. While the fundamentals of who we are and what service we provide remain unchanged, we have placed a greater emphasis on new ways we can engage with the community. You would have seen examples of this where craft and interest workshops hosted by the museum has connected the organisation with the community. The Committee would like to expand this idea further so, if you have a story to tell or have a specific skill that you would like to share with the community and would like a platform to get this out, then pop in or give us a call we would like to hear from you. Our community has a treasure trove of talented people

It recently occurred to me that most probably don't know who is on the museum governance committee. We are an interesting bunch with a wide range of skills, all with a common passion of serving the community through the museum. So, I thought I might profile a person each month, beginning with myself.

Tēnā katoa, ko Murray Seamark tōku ingoa, and I have been the Committee Chair for the past 3 years. I am a recent import to the area and have lived in Tongapōrutu for the past 5 years. Originally from South Taranaki, I grew up in the Bay of Plenty and worked in the dairy industry mainly in the Waikato. I have a

manufacturing business background which taught me the value of the team and the importance good leadership. Cynthia and I have been welcomed into this district, we feel at home here and like contributing to the many organisations that make Mōkau a great place to live. For me the museum is a place of connecting people with rich collective history of the region where individuals can gain an understanding of where they have come from, and in so impacts on the decisions they make going forward.

TAINUI HISTORICAL SOCIETY

SEVERE FLOOD DAMAGE CAUSED IN OKAU AREA

Taranaki Daily News 17 October 1949

Causing damage estimated at hundreds of pounds, the most severe flood experienced in the Okau district since 1940 completely submerged many acres of low lying land when the Tongaporutu River broke its banks and rose about 18 feet above its normal level on Saturday.

The flood reached its peak at 10 a.m. when floating drums, debris and personal property littered the district. Flood water covered the main road at the foot of Mt Messenger but did not seriously handicap motorists.

Although marooned cattle had to be removed, no serious stock losses were reported by residents last night.

The most serious loss was that of Mr Fryday who owns a logging camp situated near the river about 400 yards on the Taumaranui side of the Okau Post Office. In the camp huts, clothing, bedding, food and kitchen property suffered severe damage, a considerable amount of which is irreparable. Four mattresses were completely covered with silt and water and are a total loss. In one of the huts a kettle standing on a stove was filled with silty water and the water reached the roof in another small building. A large log hauler was completely submerged and damage estimated at about £60 or £70 was done to the engine. Two motor driven power saws were badly damaged, and other losses included four drums of petrol, several tins of oil and several hundred totara posts and strainers which were washed away by the swirling waters.

The severity of the flood was also felt at Kotare, a small settlement inland from Okau, where bridges were covered with water.

From Your Councillor

Further to last month's commentary on the Governments Three Waters Reforms, I have to say that little additional information has come out of the Government/Department of Internal Affairs (DIA, as the 'driver' of the reform process).

Councillors attended a workshop on Tuesday 21 September to discuss with our staff, their assessment of where WDC sits in the scheme of things, but it was very general as the actual drinking water standards (and their enforcement), and environmental standards (for waterways, etc) have not been finalised yet.

The third water, stormwater, is still a bit of a blank space as it is considered more complex than drinking water and wastewater. It appears stormwater will have to be treated to new specific standards before release to waterways.

Mayor Robertson and our CE are attending a hui in Taupo on Wednesday 22 September, so hopefully more details may emerge from that. These reforms are proving a huge distraction to our staff as they continue our 'business as usual' operations.

This is an interesting proposal that has a significant impact on rural communities and has the potential to significantly increase compliance cost to anyone who is providing drinking water to another. For example, a farm bore providing water to a worker's house, or a club that provides water to a community event, you are all caught up in this where you will be required to meet the established drinking water standards and monitor these. Oh, by the way these are the same standards that many Councils currently don't meet, so the bar is set quite high. 


